KSRELIEF AND WFP.. COOPERATION FOR NEW HORIZONS

A meeting of the 2nd regular session of the WFP's Executive Board 2021 was held in Rome, Italy on 15 November 2021. Dr. Abdullah Al Rabeeah, the Supervisor General of KSrelief participated as the Key Guest speaker. He said in his statement that the partnership between the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia and WFP "extends over a period of more than 45 years. This partnership began in the wake of the economic crisis of 1973."

"KSrelief deeply appreciates," Dr. Al Rabeeah stated, "the strong strategic partnership with the WFP and values the many years of close cooperation which was based on mutual dedication to providing urgent and comprehensive assistance, particularly food aid, to communities and populations facing severe food shortages due to such crises as natural disasters, conflicts, and internal and cross-border migration."

Joint Implementation Program

For Emergency agricultural livelihood assistance for people affected by conflict and COVID-19 in Yemen. The objective is to improve food security and nutrition by providing emergency agricultural livelihood assistance to farmers and families most in need in agricultural communities.

- Enhancing animal production for the beneficiary families who own livestock
- Increasing access to agricultural production and food for the most vulnerable families by providing agricultural seeds and tools
- Educating and training farmers on food security for agricultural crops and livestock farming practices.

SAVING ANAS

11-MONTH-OLD ANAS LIVES IN ADEN, YEMEN. ANAS WAS DIAGNOSED WITH ACUTE MALNUTRITION AT JUST SEVEN MONTHS. ANAS WAS ILL AND WEAK.

"I noticed my son wasn't like the other kids. He was getting weaker every day. I brought him here to see what the matter was. It seemed like something was wrong with my son's health," said Anas' mother. His mother took him to the Dar Saad health complex where she discovered that her little child was acutely malnourished. Since then, Anas has been treated at the KSrelief supported clinic in the Dar Saad health complex and receives special supplementary food every month. Now, Anas's health condition is improving.

DAR SAAD NUTRITION CLINIC IN ADEN

Over 16.2 million people in Yemen are forecast to be living with acute levels of food insecurity (IPC3+) by mid-2021, requiring immediate humanitarian intervention to survive. A contribution of USD 40 million was provided by KSrelief to the UN WFP which will enable WFP in Yemen to provide around 428,000 women and children with nutritional support to combat malnutrition for six months.
