ZAHRA'S STORY

The Waalan IDP camp in Yemen's Harad district is one of 67 internal displacement centers in Hajjah. These sites are located in the districts of Midi, Hayran, Harad, and Abs, where more than 700 displaced families live, including the family of Zahra Abkar Miswak.

Zahra, a displaced woman in her mid-fifties, lives in the Waalan IDP camp. She suffers from severe pain and internal ear disorders due to a serious injury that has led to hearing impairment, tinnitus and balance issues. She also has chronic high blood pressure.

Zahra told us her story: "As we were fleeing from our home to the displacement camp, I fell out of the car to the ground and hit the left side of my head. A few days after the accident," she continued, with her hand over her ear, "I heard a ringing in my left ear, accompanied by severe pain and dizziness, nausea and loss of balance."

She went to Waalan camp's mobile medical clinic, where she receives ongoing monitoring of her health condition. "The pain has reduced significantly, especially during the day, as a result of periodic examinations and weekly follow-ups", she said, adding that "the advice and guidance from the physician and receiving the appropriate treatment have contributed significantly to the improvement of my health."

Every month more than 360 patients, most of whom are displaced, are treated at the Waalan Medical Clinic, one of the five mobile health facilities funded by the King Salman Humanitarian Aid and Relief Centre (KSrelief) to provide high-quality primary care services in Yemen.
