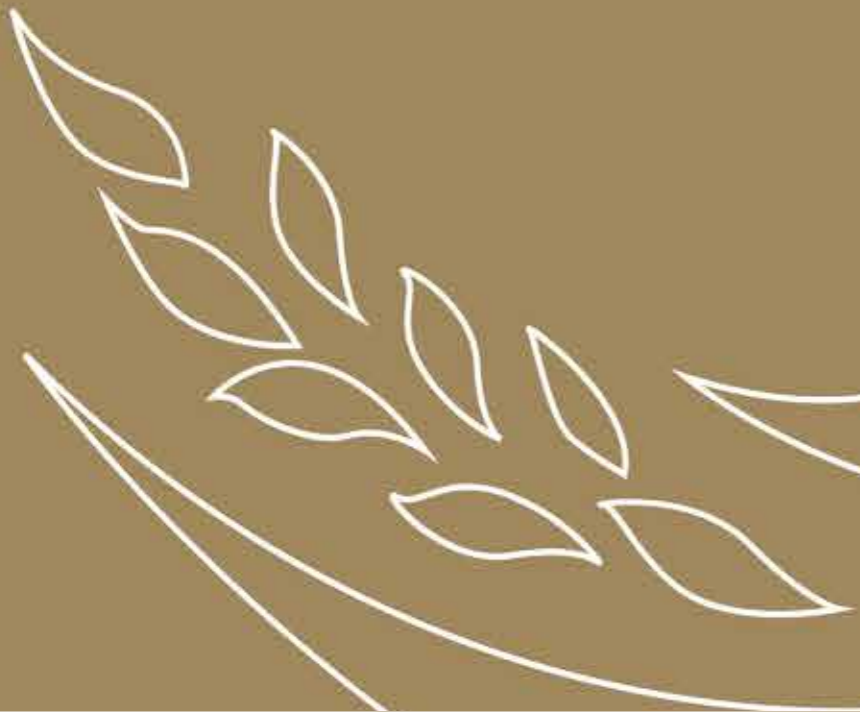

- Aid must fulfill the highest standards of quality and credibility.

The center is dedicated to accelerating the pace of its humanitarian activities to ensure that its efforts reach as many recipients as possible worldwide.



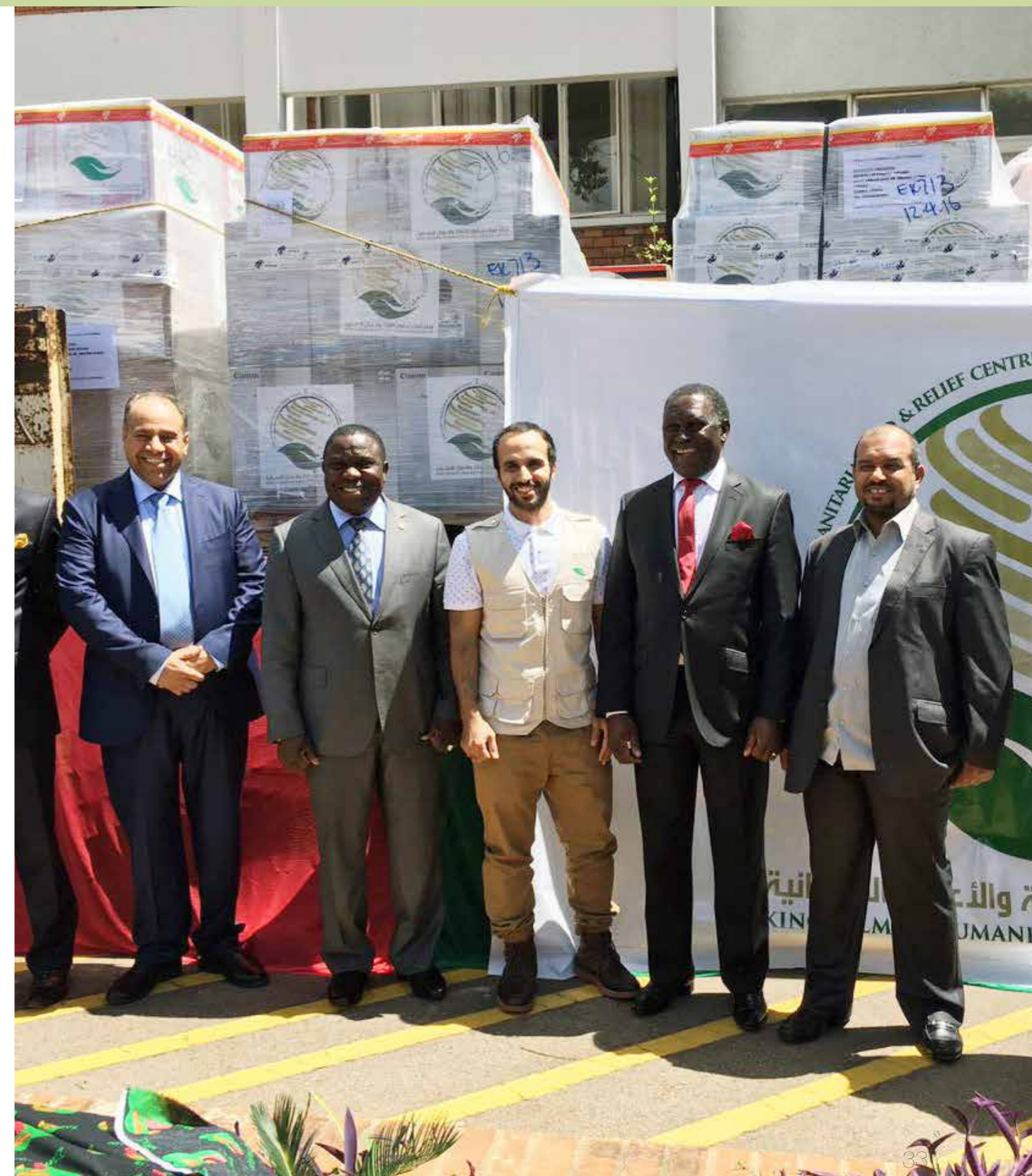

Projects in Yemen

Introduction and Scope of Work

The King Salman Humanitarian Aid and Relief Centre has launched three projects to improve the situation of people living in the most conflict-affected areas of Yemen. These initiatives include providing food security, improving living conditions in communities that remain intact, and establishing safe alternative geographical locations and support systems for people displaced by the conflict. All programs are carried out in coordination with the support of international organizations and the legitimate Yemeni government.

The scope of work also includes ensuring that adequate health care services are available to all who need them. The center assists local government personnel and international organizations specializing in medical aid to establish new health services and support existing facilities. Another of the center's activities has been repatriating Yemenis displaced outside of their country by the conflict and returning them to their homes whenever possible, since reuniting families helps to reestablish and maintain community security. Medical treatment is provided abroad for Yemenis who require such assistance, relieving the suffering of ill, injured and handicapped Yemenis receiving healthcare outside Yemen. The center has also helped to improve humanitarian conditions for people arriving to and departing from the Yemeni port-of-entry at Al-Wadiah.

All of the center's projects aim to protect the dignity of the most vulnerable groups, achieve community security and provide a healthy environment to everyone displaced by the conflict in Yemen.

Food Security Projects in Yemen

General Objective:

To provide food security in targeted areas, in coordination with international partner organizations and the legitimate Yemeni government.








Project Components:

- Improving deteriorating living conditions and inadequate food resources.
- Providing displaced people with basic goods and services.
- Assisting besieged families in conflict zones and providing them with food aid.
- Meeting the food needs of large numbers of children and the elderly.

Implementation:

Programs are implemented according to the demographical distribution in Yemen of those who are most in need. All programs are carried out with the cooperation of related civil authorities, international organizations and the legitimate Yemeni government. Projects are monitored and followed up by all parties and according to the center's mission and objectives.

Humanitarian Aid Program

Humanitarian Aid Program

General Objective:

To protect the dignity of the most vulnerable, to achieve community security by restoring family links, and to provide a healthy environment for the displaced.

Project aspects:

- To repatriate Yemenis stranded outside Yemen.
- To restore family links and maintain community security.
- To provide support for sick and handicapped Yemenis receiving healthcare services outside of Yemen.
- To improve humanitarian conditions at the Al-Wadiah port of entry.
- To assist in returning expatriates (especially Ethiopians) stranded in Yemen to their home countries, according to the laws and regulations of international migration.
- To create food security by providing meals to displaced persons gathering at the Saudi and Yemeni borders.
- To provide potable water and environmental sanitation systems at displacement camps to maintain health conditions for those living there.

Implementation Mechanisms:

- Contractual agreements with Yemen Airways through their offices in Egypt, India, Jordan, Ethiopia, Sudan, Japan and United Arab Emirates to return externally-displaced Yemenis, including the sick, elderly and children.
- Providing the externally-displaced with financial aid and allowance-in-kind.
- Sending out KSfield teams to offer food aid and environmental/sanitation services in Sharurah.
- Providing electric golf carts for use by the elderly and others with special needs.
- Building temporary shelters for displaced Yemenis in Al-Aber district (in a total area of 10,000 m2 with a capacity to house 3,000 people.)
- Opening the border ports-of-entry with Yemen to repatriate Ethiopians stranded in Yemen by the conflict, and providing air transportation for repatriation.

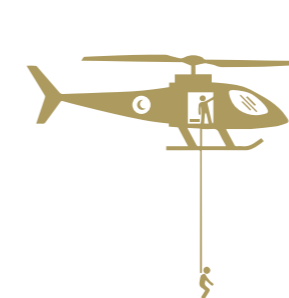

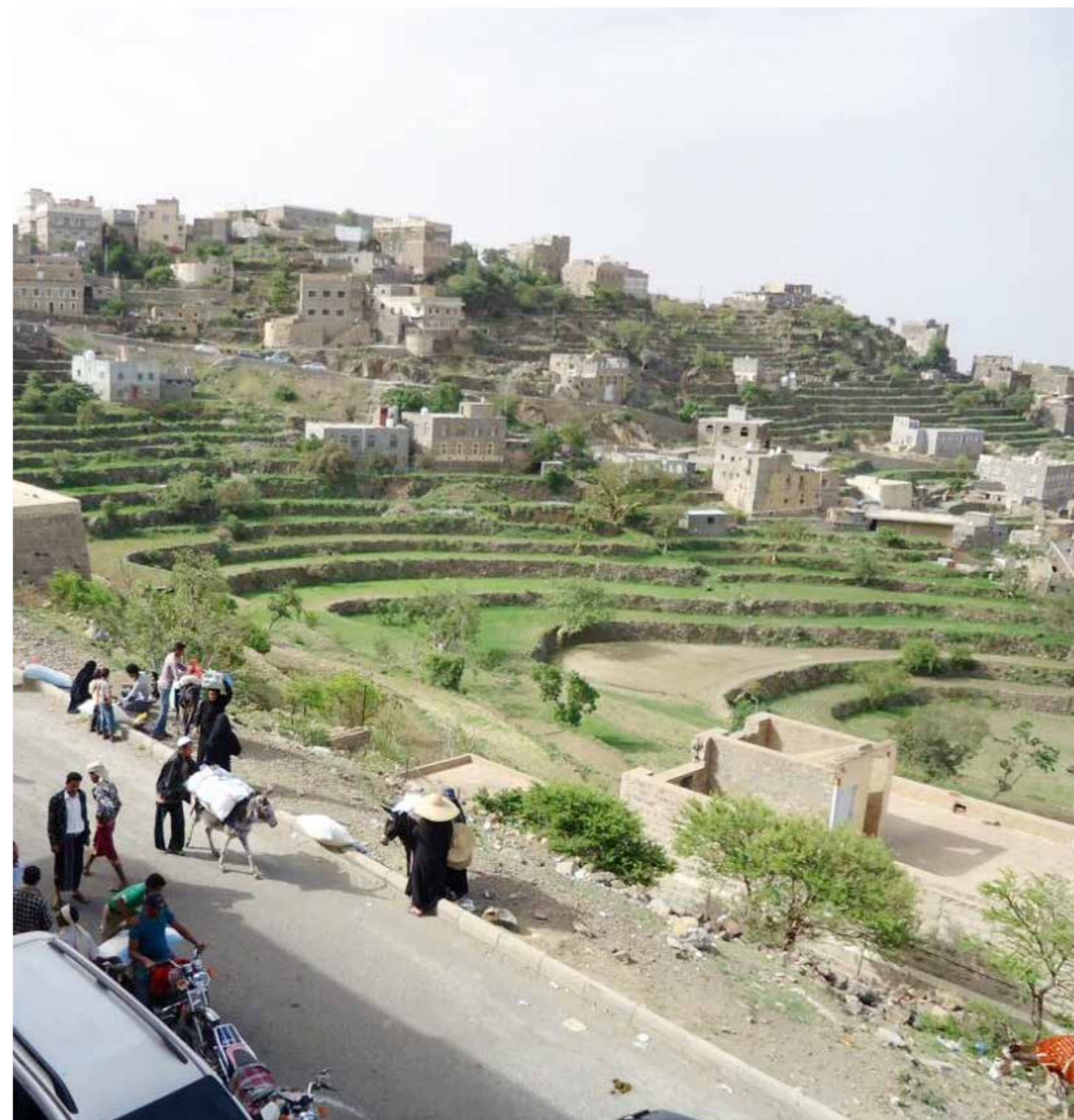

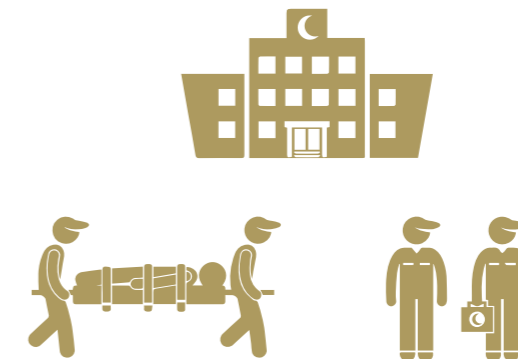
